Policy: CAD Curriculum Committees

CAD School Curriculum Committee:

The School Curriculum Committee's mission is to approve new and revised course proposals before submission for review by the College Curriculum Committee(s). The committee's responsibility is to ensure that proposed courses follow the structure designated by University guidelines and that the submitted documents are accurately completed. It will review the program learning outcomes as stated by each program within the School and identify any redundancy with approved, existing coursework.

The School Curriculum Committee is composed of one faculty member representing each school program, including graduate representation. As necessary, committees invite ad hoc representative from Facilities Management and CADTech. The faculty member who serves as the school representative on either the undergraduate or graduate CAD curriculum committee chairs their respective school committee.

Graduate and Undergraduate CAD Curriculum Committee:

The CAD Curriculum Committees (GR and UG) include an associate dean, the assistant dean of student services or an academic advisor, the scheduling officer, and one school representative from each School in CAD. In addition, the following university committees have voting representatives on the undergraduate curriculum committee - General Education Committee (GEC), Honors Curriculum Rep (HCC), Inter-College Curriculum Committee (ICC), and University Writing Committee (UWC).
