Guideline: Graduate Assistantships

Under close supervision of a faculty member, **Graduate Assistants** (GA) assist faculty with various professional and technical duties associated generally with the subjects or programs in which the Assistant is doing graduate work. **Graduate Teaching Assistants** (GTA) are appointed to assist faculty with the teaching of a class. The faculty member remains responsible for conducting the class and grading.

Job responsibilities can include the following:
