

- RIT Graduate Scholarships are awarded by academic departments in recognition of students' academic excellence.
- The amount of the award varies by student and department.
- Scholarships do not include a stipend.
- Students must maintain a minimum academic standard (3.0 grade point average per term) and make satisfactory progress toward their degrees.
- Students who qualify for a full RIT tuition waiver or full reimbursement from an employer or an outside agency are not eligible for an RIT Graduate Scholarship.
- Institutional scholarship funding will not pay audited courses when the student is registered for less than 12 credits or more than 18 credits.
- Scholarship is awarded by the program during the application process and *does not* transfer if/when a student changes programs/plans.
- Scholarship percentages are credited directly to the student's account through Student Financial Services and are applied based of the number of credits the student registers for.
- Scholarship is applied to Continuation of Thesis, but it is manually applied after the add/drop period has ended.
- Scholarship is handled in the program/department; students should contact their graduate director with specific questions.
