

To access the Student Information System (SIS) you need to have set-up your RIT computer account.

The username and password will be the same as those used for accessing your RIT email. If you need assistance setting-up your account, please refer to the materials that RIT Graduate Admissions sent to you or visit RIT's Information and Technology Services (ITS) website for new students at <https://www.rit.edu/its/help-support/getting-started/students>.

The Student Information System (SIS) is where you will complete all enrollment and registration related tasks – including: view your fall schedule, search for classes, maintain updated contact information, request transcripts, etc.

To access SIS

1. Go to :<https://www.rit.edu/infocenter/>
2. Click on the link “*Student Info System*” in the box on the left side of the page.
3. You will be asked for your RIT username and password
4. Choose an option for Multi-factor Authentication
5. You should now be on the SIS Homepage that has a series of Icons.
